HAPPY BIRTHDAY, ANDREW BAIRD July 18, 1762 - December 27, 1827

J. (Alice) Corpening, and other fine garments that date back over the past 100 years.





AN AFTERNOON TEA PARTY To Honor our Mayor

Members of the Granite Falls History Committee surprised Mayor Caryl Burns with an afternoon tea party at the Baird House on Saturday, July 23, 2022. While Dr. Burns knew about the party in advance, she did not know that she was the inspiration until the event was almost over. The ladies wanted to show their appreciation for her leadership and guidance over the years since the museum opened. After being elected Mayor in December 2021, Dr. Burns announced that she would no longer be able to serve as chairman of the group. In her place, the committee

HISTORY IN THE MAKING Saying "Good-Bye" to COVID-19 - An Unwanted, Lingering Visitor

According to the CDC Community Levels, Caldwell County remained in the medium category July 7th and 14th and climbed to the high level on July 21st. The level was still high on July 28th.

News from the Federal Government: On July 6, 2022, the U. S. Federal Drug Administration (FDA) authorized state-licensed pharmacists to prescribe Paxlovid when they have sufficient information from the patient's medical records to determine whether or not the drug is suitable and appropriate.

On July 13, 2022, the FDA issued an emergency use authorization (EUA) for the Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine for adults (18 years and older). The Novavax requires two doses administered 21 days a part. This vaccine contains the SARS-CoV-2 spike protein and Matrix-M adjuvant. The manufacturer uses insect cells to produce the spike protein and obtains materials for the Matrix-M adjuvant from the bark of the Soapbark tree in Chile.

News from the State: On July 12, 2022, N. C. Governor Roy Cooper announced that the State of Emergency he declared in response to the spread of COVID-19 on March 10, 2020 would end on August 15, 2022. He had already ended the lockdown and mask mandates, but had left in place the actual emergency declaration.
